1. TITLE OF THE CERTIFICATE (EN)

Auto body builder and repairer

2. TRANSLATED TITLE OF THE CERTIFICATE (IS)

Bifreiðasmiður - bifreiðasmíði

3. PROFILE OF KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS

The holder:

- organises and implements the work procedure in a logical way when repairing, building or exchanging faulty or damaged parts in all types of structural frames and bodywork of the most common types of vehicles and trailers
- organises logical work procedure when building new vehicles and uses his own creativity, resourcefulness and logic
- takes road safety as well as the condition, appearance and usage of the vehicle into account while doing repair work
- takes various issues into account while working, e.g. highway codes, the requirement of law and regulations on dangerous substances and work methods as well as requirements of make and equipment of vehicles
- adheres to requirements on environmental protection
- advises customers on available repairs with regard to practicality and according to their wishes, e.g. for the lowest possible repair costs
- has good interactions with colleagues and customers
- is able to complete his tasks with the aid of manuals and data on the computer and is able to do so in both Icelandic and English
- is able to record timesheets and task descriptions in the vehicle logbook and elsewhere
- is familiar with the major rules that apply to companies in the trade.

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

Auto body builders and repairers are authorised to work in auto body shops, automotive spray painting shops and auto repair shops where there is work performed on the structural frames and bodywork of smaller and larger motor vehicles. They are also authorised to work where construction and/or alterations are performed on the body, structural frames and bodywork of motor vehicles. Authorised to work as auto body builders and repairers are those who have earned a journeyman's certificate in auto body building and repair, issued by the Minister of Industry and Innovation.

6. FRAMEWORK AND ORGANISATION OF TRAINING

The average duration of the education and training programme is three and a half years, organised as follows: formal education for five school terms, totalling 90 weeks including examinations, and 48 weeks of on-the-job training. The programme concludes with a journeyman's examination.
